What are we learning?

Prep children have nearly finished their alphabet study. They have been doing lots of segmenting and blending of the sounds they know e.g. b-i-g= big - to make words. They are enjoying writing these on whiteboards and paper. They have been doing lots of experimenting with different materials and problem solving with art and craft activities related to their letters.

We can now count consistently to 20 and love to order the numbers correctly.

Year 1 are becoming confident with numbers to 100 and number facts to 10 with some different strategies. There is also a lot of testing to do- checking sight words, reading levels and spelling.

Year 5 and 6 have been practising the 3 types of sentences - simple, compound and complex and will now use them to write some really good persuasive texts. We have been flat out learning about fractions- adding and subtracting, percentages, drawing pictures to match and equivalent fractions. We know some crazy ditties to help us like 'apples 'n apples' and 'what you do to de bottom you do to de top,' 'denominator is on de bottom and de numerator is on de top.' We might celebrate our success with chocolate to share - fractionwise!

MAWA competition- Last week Graham, Darcy, Rolf and Jessica participated in a group extension maths competition. It was the first time we have done something like this and the four of them had a wonderful time. They had to confer, work things out collaboratively, check, enter the answers online and do it within a timeframe. There were 3 lots of 10 questions that they did over 2 days. They are looking forward to having another go at it next term.




HOMEWORK - please remember that 7 night reading is what we really want to see happen on a regular basis. This is the only real commitment for homework and is a vital skill for life-long learning.

Maria Montessori—Have you heard of this lady? She is a famous educator ahead of her time and gives some good advice on child raising.



19 Commandments From Maria Montessori to Help You Become the Perfect Parent

Maria Montessori is one of the small number of pedagogues who helped revolutionize how we think about raising children during the 20th century. She was well known for formulating short but memorable commandments for parents. They are all essentially straightforward, but nevertheless contain a huge amount of wisdom.

1. Children learn from what surrounds them.
2. If a child is often criticized, they learn how to condemn others.
3. If a child is often praised, they learn how to evaluate others.
4. If a child is shown hostility, they will learn to fight.
5. If you are honest with a child, they learn the meaning of fairness.
6. If a child is too often derided, they become shy.
7. If a child feels safe, they learn to trust people.
8. If a child is too often made to feel shame, they will learn to always feel guilty.
9. If a child is given frequent encouragement, they will have high self-esteem.
10. If a child is condescended to, they will learn patience.
11. If a child is given support, they will be confident.
12. If a child lives in an atmosphere of friendship and feels that others need it, they will learn how to find love.
13. Never speak badly of a child, in their presence or otherwise.
14. Concentrate on nurturing the good in a child. That way, there will be no place left in them for the bad.
15. Always listen to and answer a child's questions or requests should they approach you.
16. Respect a child even when they make a mistake. They will be able to correct their error soon enough.
17. Always be ready to help a child who requires assistance, and to stand aside when they've found everything they need.
18. Help a child to master things early. This can be done by making sure the world around them is filled with affection, peace, and love.
19. Always display the best manners to a child. Show them how to be the best they can be.
