Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL) Value – weeks 1 and 2

Strive to Achieve: I am a caring, committed, respectful learner.

As a team, we are currently reviewing the definitions of our school values, expected behaviours and positive acknowledgement system. We will look to work through some of this with the students to ensure their voice is considered in shaping these expectations.

At this stage we will continue to follow the expected behaviour chart that we have been using previously and I will share with you when this has been updated and what it looks like. If you have any suggestions/questions, please don't hesitate to pop in and share your ideas/questions.

The PBL value we've focused on this week has been

Caring: I use kind words, I use kind faces. I use manners and polite language. I look at the person I'm talking to.

Next week our focus will be on Caring: I use kind hands, I use kind feet. I play in my own space. I keep hands and feet to myself.

I shared with the children on assembly this week the importance of remembering kind words when things get challenging or don't go our way. We control our response to any situation and sometimes we need to remind ourselves to think about our words before we engage in conversation. I encourage you to share examples of when you've had to do this with your children.

Years: 3-6


Uniforms: school uniforms
